

Instructions for Authors

The instructions for authors are meant to ensure that authors abide to the journal policy and style. It is the duty of authors to familiarise with the instructions before preparing a manuscript for consideration by the journal. In this case, authors should declare during submission that they have effectively observed all the instructions.

Scope

The Journal of Migration and Security Studies (JMSS) is a peer-reviewed, interdisciplinary publication dedicated to advancing intellectual discourse on the complex interplay between migration and security. The journal serves as a platform for rigorous scholarly debates, welcoming both theoretical analyses and empirical research that contribute to a deeper understanding of present and future African perspectives in this evolving field. The scope of the journal encompasses a broad array of topics, including but not limited to strategic studies, legal frameworks, the nexus between security and migration, historical contexts, development issues, and the political dynamics shaping migration and security—particularly within the African continent. We encourage submissions that employ either comparative methodologies or in-depth single case studies, provided they offer insights with wider relevance and contribute substantively to the body of knowledge. The Journal of Migration and Security Studies invites scholars, practitioners,

and policymakers to submit manuscripts that challenge conventional wisdom, propose innovative frameworks, and expand the boundaries of current research. By fostering a multidisciplinary dialogue, the journal aims to inform effective policy responses and academic understanding in the realms of migration and security.

Ethical and legal standards

JMSS abides to the publication ethics as articulated by the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE). Editors, authors, reviewers, publisher and TRITA shall be guided by ethics as outlined by COPE.

Language

The journal uses British English

Multiple Submission policy

Submission to the JMSS means that such a manuscript is not under review or consideration by any other Journal or previously published.

Manuscript Structure

In order to maintain one format of the papers, it is mandatory that authors ensure that they strictly follow the structure of a manuscript provided. Failure to comply with this structure will lead to outright rejection of the submission.

Title

A manuscript should have a shorter and informative title. Just below the title, the author's name (Only the first and Surname) must be given with initials for middle names, followed by institutional affiliation and address, and followed by the email address.

Abstract

The abstract should have the length between 150 and 200 words. It should state the issue being addressed, the main thesis, theory (if any), methodology and key findings.

Keywords

Authors should always supply four key words related to the article. These words should be designed in such a way that it will be easy to facilitate searching of the article.

Headings and sub-headings

All first level headings should be in bold. Moreover, the second level heading should be in italic and bold.

References, citations and quotations

References, citations and quotations should use the APA style (7th Edition)

Font type, size and spacing

Book Antiqua font size 12, spacing 1.15

Discussion

The discussion should be based on evidence, sound and valid arguments. At this stage, it is expected that the author rigorously analyses issues by interrogating and interpreting facts. Authors should avoid being descriptive.

Conclusion

The conclusion should always be concise and clear. It should be derived from the discussion and main findings. The conclusion should be valid and sound.

Submission Requirements

At the moment, all manuscripts will be sent to the journal address. However, in the future, an Editorial Manager (EM) system will be acquired in order to facilitate submission and processing of manuscripts.

Types of Manuscripts

Full length articles (4500 – 6000 words including texts, notes, figures, tables, references, appendices) as well as shorter contributions (about 2500 words), book reviews (about 1000 words), important addresses (about 1000 words) and important reports and speeches (about 1000 words).

Publication

The journal will primarily be published in a digital format at the journal's independent website. In order to facilitate wide readership and prominence, publication will be done in an open-access mode whereby readers are allowed to access articles free of charge. However, very few copies may be produced for limited circulation in libraries.

Proofs

Upon acceptance, an article proof will be sent to authors by email to ensure for factual and typographic error free.

E-offprints

The author will be entitled to a pdf file of the article published free of charge for personal use.

License to Publish

The author shall sign a publication agreement prior to publication
